## Prayers of the People: A Litany of Healing

*Leader*        Let us name before God those for whom we offer our prayers.  
*All are invited to name aloud or silently any for whom you pray for God's healing.*

*Leader*        God the Father, your will for all people is health and salvation;  
*People*        **We praise you and thank you, O Lord.**

*Leader*        God the Son, you came that we might have life; and might have it more abundantly;  
*People*        **We praise you and thank you, O Lord.**

*Leader*        God the Holy Spirit, you make our bodies the temple of your presence;  
*People*        **We praise you and thank you, O Lord.**

*Leader* Holy Trinity, one God, in you we live and move and have our being;  
*People* **We praise you and thank you, O Lord.**

*Leader* Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or  
disabled, that they may be made whole;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely,  
anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness  
of your presence;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* Mend broken relationships, and restore those in emotional distress to  
soundness of mind and serenity of spirit;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* Bless physicians, nurses, and all others who minister to the suffering,  
granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold by the grace  
and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives,  
in our nation, and in the world;  
*People* **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

*Leader* You are the Lord who does wonders:  
*People* **You have declared your power among the peoples.**

*Leader* With you, O Lord, is the well of life:  
*People* **And in your light we see light.**

*Leader* Hear us, O Lord of life:  
*People* **Heal us, and make us whole.**

*Collect for the Parish, Leader and People together:*

**Loving God, who calls us to restore unity and justice, your son Jesus teaches us that love brings us together in a community where all are welcome. Help us deepen our faith and relationships so that we can grow our community to make a difference within and beyond ourselves, through Jesus Christ Our Redeemer. Amen.**

*Presider* Gracious God, we commend to your loving care all who suffer, especially those who come seeking your healing grace for themselves or others. Give them patience and hope in their distress; strengthen and uphold them in mind and body; and grant, by your intervention, that all your people may be made whole according to your desire, through Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

### **Confession**

*Presider* Let us confess our need for God's healing grace.

*Please pause and join in a moment of silent contemplation.*

**All** Compassionate God, we confess our weaknesses and our need for your strengthening touch. We confess that some illnesses stem from our own fault, while others are beyond our control. We turn to you, source of life, and ask in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ for the gifts of true healing and life in you. **Amen.**

*Presider* May the God of love visit you in your times of trial and weakness, and raise you to newness of life, through Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

### **Laying on of Hands and Anointing**

*Presider* Holy Scripture teaches us that Jesus healed many who were sick as a sign of the reign of God come near. Jesus sent the disciples to continue this work of healing in his name, that the afflicted might be raised up and their sins forgiven, bringing them to eternal salvation. By laying hands on those who were sick or in need, the disciples witnessed the marvelous power and presence of God. Pray that as we follow their example, we may experience Christ's unfailing love.

*All who wish are invited to come forward to the high altar rail for healing prayers. There are several prayer stations, which are far enough apart that you will have privacy. You can tell the clergyperson or member of the Pastoral Care Team what you would like prayers for. Please let them know if you prefer not to be anointed with the balsam-scented Oil of Healing.*
