A Note on Today's Service

Today we mark a Season of Creation with a special liturgy. It is still an Anglican Eucharist, but our prayers emphasize the natural world. They are largely drawn from those in use in Ireland in the first millennium of the Church, even as their earlier origins are French or further East. The notable exception is our alternative to the Lord's Prayer, which comes from *A New Zealand Prayer Book / He Karakia Mihinare o Aotearoa*.

Perhaps most noticeably, much of our music will be on the Celtic harp from our guest harpist, Kate Chadbourne. Our other hymns are set to melodies from Ireland, Scotland, England, and Wales. You can read more about these tunes and texts at the back of the bulletin.



THE READINGS

First Reading

Genesis 2:18-24

The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said,

"This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken."

Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

The Epistle

Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. But someone has testified somewhere,

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them?

You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, subjecting all things under their feet."

Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.


It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, saying,

"I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."

Holy Gospel

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Some Pharisees came, and to test Jesus they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her." But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

Great Thanksgiving





About this Morning's Music

This morning's lovely hymn melodies were originally heard in rural communities and local gatherings in Celtic nations long ago, and have survived for centuries. The tunes hail from Ireland, Scotland, Brittany, England, and Wales. They are set to prayers and texts ranging from the 17th to the 20th centuries from the pens of Isaac Watts, Fred Pratt Green, Francis Wile, F. Bland Tucker, Sylvia Dunstan, and others.

Our guest harpist Kate Chadbourne has provided additional background about her instrumental and vocal selections.

This morning's Prelude "Sí Beag Sí Mór" was composed by Irish harper, Turlough O'Carolan who lived and worked in the late 17th and early 18th centuries. The title "The Small Fairy Mound and the Big Fairy Mound" refers to a battle between two fairy hosts that was ultimately resolved in a peaceful, enchanting way. Apparently, Turlough witnessed this himself.

Our Musical Offering, "Bheir Mi O" is a song well-known in Ireland, particularly in the north, and very much influenced by Scottish singing and music. It conveys both longing for love and the exaltation of union with a beloved. Kate especially loves the lines, "In my harp there was no music, in my fingers there was no spark, until you announced your intention and I got wind of my destiny." She welcomes the congregation to sing along to this lovely old song, aloud at home, or in your heart.

The Communion Meditation "Bridget Cruise, 2nd melody" was also composed by Irish harper, Turlough O'Carolan, as a planxty or praise music for one who had won his heart (but alas, sometimes did not return his affections). Apparently, O'Carolan composed this after spending the afternoon stretched out on a rath or fairy mound.

Kate's Postlude this morning is an original jig, "Take Your Next Step," which she composed in honor of all those who are bravely setting forth on fresh adventures.
